# Study Finds More Than 14:1 Return On **Manufacturing Extension Program**

A new study of the Manufacturing Extension Partnership, or MEP, part of the National Institute of Standards and Technology, finds that the program generates an economic and financial return of more than 14:1 for the \$140 million the federal government spends on it per year. The Upjohn Institute study, looking at fiscal year 2018, follows up on an <u>Institute study for 2017</u> finding a similar return.

MEP centers help small and medium-size manufacturing businesses with product development, tools and resources for business expansion, and business continuity planning, letting the businesses save money to invest in improved products and processes. These improvements in turn improve the economy by creating jobs, increasing earnings and expanding the tax

The study is consistent with Upjohn Institute research finding that customized business services such as manufacturing extension can be 10 times as effective as tax incentives in creating local jobs. Communities that invest in customized services for local businesses perform better than those relying on business tax cuts or tax incentives.

## **Mexico: General Import and Export Tax** Law effective June 1

On October 23, 2018, the Mexican Government published in its Official Gazette an amendment to Annex 2.4.1. (known as the "NOM Annex") of the "General Import and Export Tax Law," which identifies the HS codes of imported products subject to NOM compliance. The key change is that the importer can no longer use the exceptions listed in Article 10, Section VII (products imported for the company's own use) and section VIII (products that will be used for professional use, industrial or manufacturing process) to import the product without a compliance certificate. An extension was granted by the Secretariat of Economy to comply with this amendment and the change will be effective on the first working day of June 2019. We encourage U.S. companies to work with their Mexican importer to confirm if their product must comply with mandatory NOM certification.
